



## Kerry South Constituency Poll

RED C interviewed a constituency quota controlled sample of 500 people representative of all adults aged 18+ across the constituency.

Seed sample was drawn in proportion to population within each DED in the constituency and an RDD (random digit dial) process used to ensure all households were included for contact by telephone.

Vote Intentions analysis is based off recall interviews conducted between the 9<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> February once full candidate lists were available, while other question data was conducted between the 3rd February – 9<sup>th</sup> February 2011.

The data was weighted to known demographics, population within each DED and weighted by past vote in the constituency.


The accuracy of the data is estimated to be + or - 4.5% at 95% confidence.

## **Poll Summary - I**



- 1. Fine Gael are the big winners in the Kerry South constituency, with this poll suggesting they will take 2 seats, despite the party not substantially increasing its share of the first preference vote since 2007.
- 2. The contest is very tight between five or six candidates, so this results could certainly change and there is still plenty to play for; particularly with 15% still undecided on how they will vote.
- 3. Fianna Fail lose out heavily according to the poll, securing no seats and a greatly reduced party share this means that despite himself retaining much of his first preference vote, John O'Donoghue loses his seat at the final count, mainly due to being transfer unfriendly, although he does gain some transfer from Healy Rae.
- 4. Independent candidates feature prominently, increasing their overall share of the vote substantially to 39% of first preferences compared to just 15% in 2007.
- However, Michael Healy Rae looks set to possibly lose his fathers seat he secures just 13% of the first preference vote and is eliminated in the 4<sup>th</sup> count.
- 6. Instead Tom Fleming tops the poll, despite getting less first preference votes than four other candidates, as he is very transfer friendly he is the only candidate to make quota on the fifth count after Healy Rae is eliminated.


## **Poll Summary - II**



- 8. Labour do relatively poorly compared to their national position, with Marie Maloney securing just 15% first preference share, and despite being relatively transfer friendly she is eliminated on the fifth count.
- 9. Local issues and personality dominate choice of candidate, particularly for Independent vote share.
- 10. Only 7% of all voters suggest that the party leader had any impact on their vote choice, and even party preference and policy preference was only mentioned by 1 in 5.
- 11. The economy and jobs dominates the issue that voters are concerned about, with other issues very much further down the line of priorities.
- 12. Health, education, roads/infrastructure and taxation follow up as issues that voters are particularly concerned about.
- **13**. Finally, the majority (67%) do not believe that any new government will be able to renegotiate the terms of the EU/IMF bailout.

The electorate within the constituency has a significantly stronger middle age profile and has a higher than average proportion of farmers

(Base: All Adults Kerry South 18+ - 500)





## Share of first preference vote across candidates if there were to be a general election tomorrow







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
